Once upon a time, an old man lived with his three





SGT. KEITH CLARK BROKEN TAPS

Army Sgt. Keith Clark wasn't your stereotypical military man. He never rushed the enemy under a hail of gunfire, and with his black horn-rimmed glasses, he looked more professor than soldier.

But as the principal bugler for the U.S. Army

band, Clark served his country in a different but still critical way: he played "Taps" at President John F. Kennedy's funeral. He had blown the haunting, 24-note melody flawlessly thousands of times before, but on this day, after waiting for hours in the cold and under unprecedented pressure, Clark uncharacteristically missed the sixth note.

It should have been a disaster, but to a grieving nation, the broken sound came across as a wail, a sob, as if the bugler and his trumpet were also crying for their fallen leader. Clark's broken rendition of Taps became one of most iconic moments of the four-day memorial. At the Military Heritage Museum, we detail Clark's story, show a video and display his uniform in tribute to the all-too -human soldier-musician who inadvertently provided the sound to match his country's sorrow.
